Notes for Leaders

Speaking Parts

There are six sections with a total of 72 lines that can be assigned to four or more children. There are also 13 Scripture readings (indicated by an \mathbb{R} in the script) that can be read by one or more child(ren) or an adult. Longer readings can also be broken up to accommodate the number of parts needed. Children may also be assigned as "Leaders" of liturgy and prayers. Main character roles include two News Anchors, an Investigative Reporter (Sawyer Snoop), a Cub Reporter, a Census Recorder, an Innkeeper, a Citizen, a Shepherd, a Wise Man and Simeon. Character assignments are flexible. For example, if there are not enough children to play all roles, multiple character parts can be assigned to a child. All characters should be dressed in biblical era costumes. Note: Names of anchors and certain other characters are not specified; however, where "____" is noted in the script, any name can be inserted.

Children's Songs

Songs by children are indicated in the script and include "O Little Town of Bethlehem," "Go Tell It on the Mountain" and "Away in a Manger" (for youngest children). Additionally, children can be assigned verses for congregational hymns, if desired. All children with speaking and non-speaking parts should gather to sing in a designated area.

Sets and Centerpiece Display

The following separate sets are needed and can be staged according to the space available.

- 1) A TV News Room: a desk with two chairs for news anchors. Either as a backdrop or posted on front of the desk should be the words "Bethlehem News Network" or "BNN."
- 2) Interview Area: This is where "Sawyer Snoop" will interview various characters throughout the script. It should be located somewhere offside of news room set. A real or toy microphone can be used for interviewing.
 - 3) Nativity Scene (optional): If using a nativity tableau, the manger scene should be located off to the side or behind the news room set, in a different location than the interview area.
- 4) Centerpiece Display: A large piece of foam core or poster board (can be on an easel or posted on a wall that is easily visible to congregation) with the words "Bethlehem News Network" or "BNN" posted on the top. Throughout the script as indicated, the Cub Reporter will post the following screeenshots on the board:
 - a. Something Big Coming to Bethlehem
 b. New King Born In a Barn
 c. UFO Sighting Outside of Bethlehem
 d. Outcasts Share the Inside Scoop
 e. Celestial Sign Draws Visitors From the East
 f. Baby Jesus Is the Word Made Flesh

The centerpiece should be set up in a prominent location. Breaking News screenshots are included and can be printed out and fastened in different places on a large piece of foam core or poster board, if desired. Depending on the construction of the Breaking News foam core or poster board, use tape, push pins or other means to fasten the screenshots to the board. The last screenshot, "Baby Jesus Is the Word Made Flesh," should be placed in the center of the board.

Nativity Tableau

The script calls for costumed nativity characters, including Mary, Joseph, angels, shepherds and wise men. Instructions are included in the script as to when these characters should enter and exit. The nativity tableau is optional. An alternative to a live tableau would be to project images of characters on a screen where indicated in the script. Another option would be to have Sunday School teachers or other adults play these parts. If none of these options is feasible, the tableau can be eliminated.

A Meditation

E "Breaking news." Those words get our attention when we hear them on the TV or radio, or when we get an alert on our phones. We immediately want to know what's going on. Our reaction to breaking news may be one of celebration, or it may invoke fear, sadness, concern or even debate. Today, the children will share with us breaking news—not from today's headlines, but from the Word of God. It's the story of the birth of Jesus—the Word Made Flesh. It is news that has broken out over and over again throughout the Bible. It wasn't angels who first broke the news of Jesus, nor the shepherds who spread the word around Bethlehem. From the creation account to the messages of the prophets, all of God's Word proclaims a Savior who has the final word on sin, death and Satan, restoring our relationship with God. It's an age-old story just as fresh today as it ever was because the Good News of Jesus breaks through our darkness every day. For some, this news may cause fear, concern or debate. Some won't believe it at all. But for those who believe, it is our hope, peace, joy and our life! Have you heard the Word? It is Jesus. Let us worship him today.
