

Do you see the Savior who comes to seek the lost like you?

Hide and seek is fun to play. That's what happens Easter Day.

Not with eggs and baskets, though. Not with brand-new Easter clothes.

> Not with chicks and jelly beans. That is not what Easter means.

Look past all those things with me. Tell me, what else can you see?

Look for something so much more, something God has got in store.

Something hidden many years. Someone special who appears from the tomb on Easter morn so that we might be reborn.

Born in a Barn

Do you see the Savior? The search has just begun. His **star** is rising in the east, bright as the shining sun. **Three kings** have followed faithfully to where the star has led. The Savior of the world found in a humble **manger** bed.



A Manger

Day 1 • Luke 2:4-12

The search for the Savior began just outside the Garden of Eden. Adam and Eve had disobeyed God. Sin was in the world. Creation was in need of a Savior. God made a promise in that garden to Adam and Eve—a promise that the Savior would come. God's people had been on the lookout ever since, waiting and hoping and searching for the Savior.

Is this really where our journey through Lent begins? At the first Christmas? Let's look for the manger and see.

Star

Day 2 • Matthew 2:1-6

The prophets from the Old Testament wrote clues about where to find the Savior. Clues that came right from God. They wrote that God was sending the world a Child. They even wrote where to look for that Savior: in the tiny town of Bethlehem.

Why, the only thing that would make finding the Savior easier would be to shine a bright light down from heaven on the place he was born. Oh, that's right! God did that too.

Three Kings

Day 3 • Matthew 2:9-11

Magi from a far eastern land are following a star, seeking out the newborn baby. This is no ordinary child, you see. This is our Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace.

There is more to this manger Child than meets the eye. Let's join the Magi in their search for the King of kings.

A Locust

Day 4 • Mark 1:4-6

"There was a man named John," the Bible tells us (John1:6). And that man was a little strange. He ate nothing but wild honey and ... gulp ... locusts! (You can find one hidden in the picture.)

But strange as that man was, he had a very special message to bring. "The Savior is almost here. God's promise is coming true. So let's get ready!" That news doesn't sound strange at all.

Sandals

Day 5 • Luke 3:15-16

The people came to John asking if he was the Savior. But John was quick to tell them that he was not. "The Savior is so great," John said, "that I'm not even worthy to untie his sandals!"

But John *was* worthy. God made him worthy enough to baptize the Savior of the world. And although we do not seem worthy to accept the coming Savior, God's grace and love make us worthy too. Just like John.

A Dove

Day 6 • Matthew 3:16-17

Do you see the Savior? God the Father is pointing from heaven. "This is my beloved Son. I am pleased with him," God says. And the Holy Spirit is there, flying down like a dove to point to the Savior. He's right here!

Through the waters of baptism, you are made a beloved child of God the Father. The Holy Spirit fills your heart, and your forehead is marked with the Savior's cross. Where is the coming Savior? He's right here! Right now! In you!

Baptized With Water

Do you see the Savior? Is he here at the pool? Take off your **sandals**. Stay awhile. The water's fresh and cool. A man is eating **locusts**. He speaks of God above. The Savior might stop for a swim. Look for the Spirit's **dove**.



Bread

Day 7 • Matthew 4:1-4

The devil has come to tempt the Savior to sin. "If you are really God's promised one," the devil says, "turn this stone to bread." Jesus had not eaten in forty days. A bite of bread would really hit the spot. Satan knows just what tempts you the most.

There are more important things than bread, Jesus tells the devil. God's Word is all we need to survive.

The World

Day 8 • Luke 4:5-8

Now what is the devil up to? He is asking Jesus to bow down and worship him. "I can give you power over all the world," Satan says.

That sounds pretty tempting, but Jesus is the Son of God. Jesus is the King of kings, and he already has power over the whole world and everything in it.


"Worship the Lord your God and serve him only," Jesus says. Satan should be the one doing the bowing.

Two Angels

Day 9 • Matthew 4:8-11

The devil said to Jesus, "throw yourself down from the highest point of the temple. For it is written: 'God will command his angels to guard you carefully ... so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.'" Satan is using God's own words to tempt Jesus.

But our Savior knows *all* of what the Scriptures have to say. "Do not put the Lord your God to the test." The devil leaves, defeated. And God's angels arrive to care for Jesus. The only true words the devil spoke were God's words after all.



What Tempts You?

Do you see the Savior? He is here but not alone. Someone tempts him with a snack: some **bread** made from a stone. "Bow to me," the devil says, "I'll give the **world** to you." "Jump! **Angels** will stop your fall." What will the Savior do?
