About the Object Lessons for Chapel Talks

In these 47 object lessons for chapel talks, based on the appointed Gospel readings for the Sundays of the 2025-2026 school year, students learn from God's Word **as they prepare to hear the Good News proclaimed on the coming Sunday**. Each lesson includes suggested Bible readings, hymns, a children's message and a brief prayer based on the coming Sunday's Bible readings. Preparing for August 10, 2025

Theme Verse

For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. Luke 12:34

Bible Readings

Genesis 15:1-6; Psalm 33:12-22; Hebrews 11:1-16; Luke 12:22-34 (35-40)

Needed

A picture of a treasure chest

Message

🗨 Hello, boys and girls. (*Show the picture of a treasure chest.*) What is this a picture of? (*Allow the children to answer.*) That's right! It is a treasure chest. You have probably seen movies where people are trying to find a treasure chest like this somewhere deep in the ocean so that they can become rich. We all want to be rich, don't we? Yes, of course. But Jesus in his preaching tells us that we don't need to be rich in the things of this world, like clothing and houses and cars and jewelry. No, we need to be rich in the things of God. What are the things of God? They are things like love, faith, grace, hope, peace and joy. These are the treasures that we will take with us to heaven. So think about this today: We are rich because God has already given us these things through Jesus. Jesus came to die on the cross for our sins so that we might receive these riches of heaven.

That is why it is good for us to go to church every Sunday. We are reminded there that we have so much to be thankful for that comes from heaven. We sing songs about the treasures of God there. We listen to his Word, the Bible, which tells us about the treasure we have with our faith in Jesus. We pray to God there to keep in touch with the One who supplies us with everything we need to stay close to him.

When we are rich with the treasures of heaven, we look at the world in a whole new way. The things of this earth do not seem as important to us, and we hold onto our possessions a little more loosely because we know that they will not last.

What will last, we know, are the things of God that will take us to heaven. The blessing of forgiveness won for us by Jesus removes our sins from us so that we can be with Jesus forever in heaven. The blessing of salvation from death that is given to us on the cross of Jesus carries us to everlasting life after our time on earth comes to an end. The blessing of power over the devil, which Jesus achieved on the cross, helps us to stay strong in our faith to the end when the devil tries to tempt us. These blessings are treasures that will never rust or grow old or be destroyed. They will enrich our lives always. Let us pray:

Preparing for August 17, 2025

Theme Verse

[Jesus said], "Do you think that I have come to give peace on earth?
No, I tell you, but rather division." Luke 12:51

Bible Readings

Jeremiah 23:16-29; Psalm 119:81-88; Hebrews 11:17-31 (32-40), 12:1-3; Luke 12:49-53 (54-56)

Songs

I Will Follow You; Follow You Anywhere; Guide Me, O Thou Great Redeemer

Needed

Two pictures of an arrow, one pointing left and one pointing right

Message

📖 Hello, boys and girls. What are these pictures of? (*Hold up the pictures of the arrow pointing right and the arrow pointing left, and allow the children to respond.*) That's right! They are pictures of two arrows pointing in opposite directions. Jesus says that people will go in different directions in their opinions about him. Some will believe in him and go on his way, and some will not believe in him and go the opposite way. Which direction do you want to go? Do you want to go for Jesus or against Jesus? (*Allow the children to respond.*) For Jesus, of course! Jesus said in the Bible, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). Jesus is always the way we should go.

But we want more people to go in the direction of Jesus, don't we? Maybe you know someone who does not believe in Jesus. You can tell that person how much Jesus means to you and how much Jesus loves them. Then maybe they will turn around and go in the direction of Jesus with you. You can also pray for those who do not believe in Jesus. You can pray that the Holy Spirit would work in the hearts of unbelievers so that they would come to know the truth that Jesus is their Savior from sin, death and the devil. Those who have a change of heart through the Holy Spirit will join you in church and in Sunday school and wherever the disciples of Christ gather. You can be a friend to them and welcome them into your group. You can make them feel comfortable and special. It is hard being the new kid on the block when it comes to following Jesus, so you can be the one to help them see what a good thing it is to know Jesus.

In our journey through life, the devil can sometimes tempt us to go the other way, away from Jesus and toward things that are evil or mean or selfish or prideful. (*Hold up the "opposite" arrow.*) The devil can make us think only of ourselves and about putting others down. We should never go down that path. But we should keep on the path to Jesus, even when we are tempted to do something different. Staying on the path to Jesus puts him first in our lives and helps us to raise others up with encouraging words and compliments that celebrate the people that they are in Christ. So go the way of Jesus today and every day, and enjoy the journey. Let us pray:

- 📖 Dear Jesus, let us walk on the road that leads to you and never think of turning away from you. Help us to lead more people to your way. Amen.

Preparing for August 24, 2025

Theme Verse

People will come from east and west, and from north and south, and recline at table in the kingdom of God. And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last. Luke 13:29-30

Bible Readings

A picture of a table

Message

📖 Hello, boys and girls. What is this a picture of? (*Hold up the picture of a table, and allow the children to respond.*) That's right! It is a picture of a table. Jesus says that people from all over will sit at a table with him in the kingdom of God. It is a beautiful image of what it will be like for us in heaven when we will be with Jesus and all his saints.

Those who sit at the table with him are not the ones who think highly of themselves or think that they have a right to be there because of what they have done in life. No, Jesus says the people at the table will be those who are humble, those who think of

themselves last and those who know that they do not deserve to be at the table with him.

We live in a world that praises those who win first place or are the most famous or popular. That is why it is hard for us to be humble and to look to Jesus for forgiveness. But that is what we are called to do. We are to be sorry for our sins. We are to remember that Jesus is the center of our lives, not ourselves. We are to consider the needs of others before our own. We are to recall that there is nothing we can do to have a place at God's table. Only through the cross of Jesus do we receive the right to be called children of God and have a place at his table.

Whenever you sit around the dinner table with your family this week, think about the time to come when we will sit around the table with Jesus in heaven and give praise to him for making us a part of the family of God forever. Let us pray:

Preparing for August 31, 2025

Theme Verse

[Jesus said,] “When you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, ‘Friend, move up higher.’ Then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at table with you.” Luke 14:10

Bible Readings

Proverbs 25:2-10; Psalm 131; Hebrews 13:1-17; Luke 14:1-14

Songs

Needed

Two pictures of an arrow, one pointing up and one pointing down

Message

📖 Hello, boys and girls. What are these pictures of? (*Hold up the pictures of the two arrows, and allow the children to respond.*) That’s right! They are pictures of an arrow pointing up and an arrow pointing down. In our world today, people like to move up the ranks, get a better job, become more popular on social media with more and more likes. They like to promote themselves and make themselves look good to others. The “up” arrow would describe these types of people.

But Jesus says that we should not be like that. He said we should humble ourselves, put others before us and not draw attention to ourselves. The “down” arrow would describe what Jesus wants us to be.

But the amazing thing that Jesus does is that he takes those who are humble (*Show “down” arrow*) and lifts them up to be with him (*Show “up” arrow*). Jesus makes those who are humble the greatest in his kingdom. And those who think only of themselves are lower in the kingdom (*Show the “down” arrow*).

Jesus is in the highest place, heaven, (*Show “up” arrow*) because he humbled himself and lowered himself to death, death on a cross (*Show “down” arrow*). We are lifted up because Jesus was lifted up from death on Easter morning when he rose from the grave (*Show “up” arrow*). Now, we who put Jesus first in our lives have a place in heaven with him. Therefore, with humble yet happy hearts, we lift up our praises to Jesus, who is seated on the throne above, full of all power and might. Let us pray:

Prayer

- 📖 Jesus, you are the greatest of all. Help us never to put ourselves above you, but may we always let you lift us up to where you are. Amen.

Preparing for September 7, 2024

Theme Verse

[Jesus said to the crowd,] “So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple.” Luke 14:33

Bible Readings

Deuteronomy 30:15-20; Psalm 1; Philemon 1-21; Luke 14:25-35

Songs

You Are the Way; What Is the World to Me; Step by Step

Needed

A backpack with toys, clothes and books

Message

☐ Hello, boys and girls. What do I have here? (*Hold up backpack, and allow the children to respond.*) That’s right! It is a backpack. What is a backpack used for? (*Allow the children to respond.*) That’s right! A backpack is used to carry things around. Let me see what I have here in this backpack. I have some toys (*Hold up toys*). I have some clothes (*Hold up clothes*). And I have some books (*Hold up books*). These are things that are important to us in this world, but Jesus says that nothing is more important than he is.

We should never let the things of this earth like toys and popular clothes and books distract us from Jesus and what he wants us to do. And what does he want us to do?

The Bible says he wants us to prepare ourselves to live for him. He wants us think seriously about what it means to be his disciple. He wants us to be ready for whatever may come our way in our walk with him. Reading the Bible, saying prayers and going to church are ways that help us stay focused on him and not on the things of the world.

So while your backpacks (and what's inside them) are important, never make them more important than Jesus. You can read the Bible or pray or go to church. Then carry Jesus with you wherever you go and whatever you do! He will make your life special and worthwhile beyond your imagination. Let us pray:
